

# South Africa to start processing group visa applications for Chinese, Indian tourists

South Africa will start receiving group visa applications from selected tour operators on behalf of Chinese and Indian tourists in mid-February, an official from the Department of Home Affairs said on Tuesday. Yusuf Simons, Western Cape provincial manager at the Department of Home Affairs, said in an interview with Xinhua that South Africa has selected 65 tour operators from South Africa, India and China for the Trusted Tour Operator Scheme (TTOS) to submit group visa applications by Chinese and Indian tourists to visit the country. The TTOS was announced last year to boost tourism arrivals from China and India, as Chinese tourists account for only 1.8 percent and Indian tourists 3.9 percent of all international visitors to South Africa. ## Chinese companies to build Tanzania railway line

Two Chinese companies have won the tender to construct a 282-kilometre standard-gauge railway line between Tanzania and Burundi. Tanzanian Transport Minister, Makame Mbarawa, announced the winning bidders – China Railway Engineering Group Ltd and China Railway Engineering Design and Consulting Group – during the contract signing ceremony recently. The African Development Bank will finance the project to build the railway line, which will connect to the standard-gauge railway that is already under construction for the state-owned Tanzania Railway Corporation. The railway line will link Dar es Salaam with Port Mwanza on Lake Victoria and Port Kigoma (Ujiji) on Lake Tanganyika, closely following the route of the existing metre-gauge railway. Freight News.

#### Kenya-China partnership accelerates digital transformation, officials say

Kenya's longstanding partnership with China has played a crucial role in advancing the country's transition to a more inclusive digital economy, senior officials said Tuesday. Kenya has leveraged its cooperation with the Chinese government and enterprises to lay the foundation for a thriving knowledge-based economy, said Harriette Chiggai, who serves in the Office of the Women Rights Advisor to the President. #### China National Petroleum Resumes Crude Production in South Sudan

Dar Petroleum Operating Co. has resumed producing oil from a number of its wells in South Sudan after almost a year, people with knowledge of the matter said. The company, operated by China National Petroleum Corp., China Petroleum & Chemical Corp. and state-owned Nile Petroleum Corp., has reopened four batches of wells, one of the people said, asking not to be identified as they are not authorized to speak publicly on the matter.
