China's monthly bauxite imports exceed 20 million mt, with Guinea's bauxite imports repeatedly hitting record highs

According to the General Administration of Customs of China, China imported 20.684 million mt of bauxite in April 2025, up 25.62% MoM and 45.44% YoY, hitting a record high. From January to April 2025, China's cumulative bauxite imports reached 67.77 million mt, up 34.3% YoY. In April, China imported 16.732 million mt of bauxite from Guinea, up 28.72% MoM and 59.62% YoY, setting a new monthly import record. Shanghai Metals Market.
