China backs Starmer's Chagos deal

The Chinese government has welcomed Sir Keir Starmer's Chagos Islands deal as a "massive achievement", despite his claim that Beijing had opposed it. Beijing's ambassador to Mauritius talked up the deal in a speech on Tuesday, after Sir Keir signed away the Chagos Islands and agreed to pay Mauritius £30 billion over 99 years. Huang Shifang told guests at the Chinese embassy that her government offered "massive congratulations" on the deal, and that China "fully supports" Mauritius's attempt to "safeguard national sovereignty".
